

Who May Apply?

Aim High Flight Academy Student Application and Nomination Information

Student Eligibility Criteria:

1. High school students aged 16-18; or ROTC/USAFA cadets
2. Students must be at least 16 years old by June 1st in the year of the desired AIM HIGH Flight Academy
3. Students must have an unweighted cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of 3.0 or above on a 4.0 scale
4. The student's High School Official must provide a verified GPA transcript
5. Students must **not** hold a private pilot's certificate or license
6. Parent/Legal Guardian signed approval is required for all minors and high school students
7. COVID-19 vaccinations and health safety procedures must be followed in accordance with university policies

Students initiate their AHFA scholarship application online at <https://www.recruiting.af.mil/Aim-High-Flight-Academy/> by clicking the link under the How to Apply tab. The student will provide contact information for the nominator and school official, and they will receive emails with links to complete their nomination and transcript submission. If your nominator is affiliated with any of our strategic partners, please indicate that on the nominator contact information. Application and documents must be submitted within the application window time. Late applications will not be accepted.

1. Student follows the application instructions. If the student has any questions while applying, they may send questions to AFRS Det 1 via Afrs.ahfa.studentapplications@us.af.mil
2. Student responds to profile and application questions online
3. Student provides their school GPA transcript Official Contact information online
4. Student submits a Nominator/Recommender name and contact information online
5. The nominating or recommending person will be prompted via email to accomplish the Student Nomination Assessment
6. Student accomplishes the Activity Sheet Responses online
7. Student accomplishes the Creative Essay online
8. Submits Creative Graphic by uploading it as pdf or word text file
9. Submits Parental/Legal Guardian approval. Student is responsible to obtain and upload verifiable Parent/Legal guardian signed document. Format in pdf or word text
10. Student accepts program certification guidelines to participate in the program
11. Student is responsible for ensuring all the required application responses are complete, nominating official is accurate, and all documents (GPA transcript, Activity Sheet, Essay and Graphic, as well as Parent/Legal Guardian approval) are submitted successfully.
