	4. The Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP) is a free service to allow U.S. citizens and nationals traveling abroad to enroll their trip with the nearest U.S. Embassy or Consulate.	
	5. It is always important to know how to locate the nearest embassy or conservator in each country you are visiting.	
	6. Before you plan on visiting a country, find out about any travel alerts and warnings that might be associated with the country.	
	7. In countries like China, a lot of people speak English. It would not be worth the investment to hire someone to interpret for you.	
	8. You should also leave a copy of the itinerary with family or a friend in case you need to be reached in an emergency.
